Timeline of "Slave's Sword" and "Imperial Knights"

The stories of "Slave's Sword" and "Imperial Knights" happen simultaneously, but in different places.

Luna, who had belonged to the knight corps of the Imperial Capital Maldonia, left the group, harboring questions towards the Empire's invasive methods.

She left home to the Free City Selway, where she starts life as a mercenary, and a half year ~ one year later, is when "Slave's Sword" starts."

A half year ~ one year after Luna leaves home, "Imperial Knights" starts at the Arsully home, with Diana.

To say it simple, even if you haven't played "Dragon Quest 3," you can still enjoy "Dragon Quest 1."

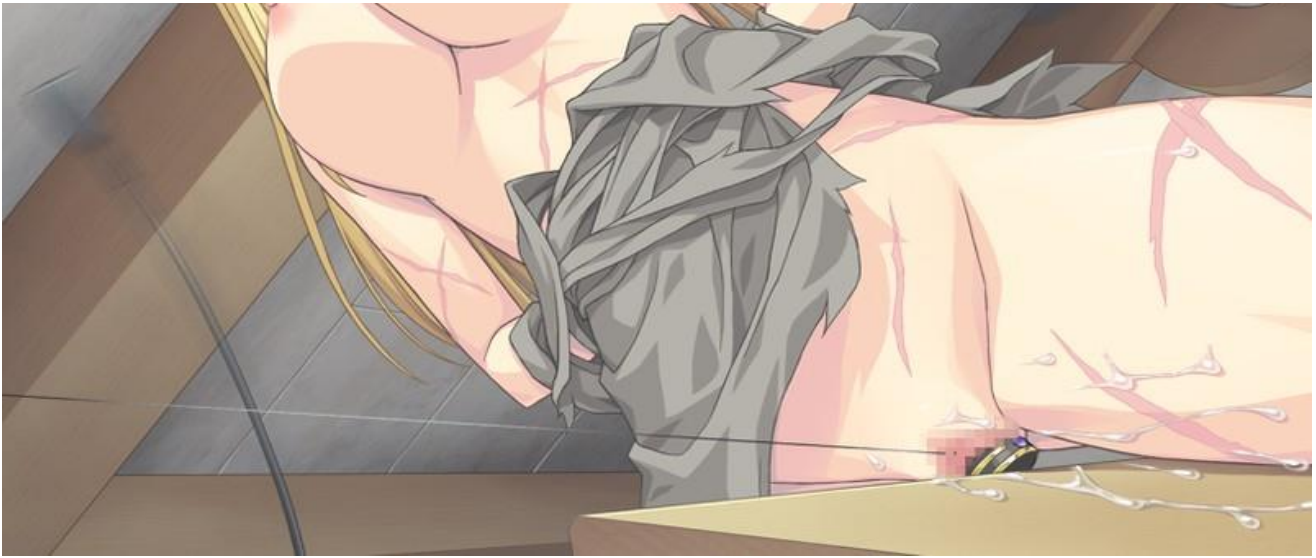
But, if you've played "Dragon Quest 3," you can enjoy "Dragon Quest 1" more deeply.
